Please note that payment of your membership fees must be provided with your application (if applicable), and can only be made using one of the methods above.

How to calculate your membership fees:

For your information the membership subscription year runs from 1st January until 31 December.

You will need to pay the period up until 31 December for the current year and if you are applying to be a Student member you must be a member until the 31 December in the year that you are sitting examinations.

The current yearly Membership subscription rates are as follows:

Membership applications are approved on the 1st of the following month which you apply. To calculate your membership fees divide the amount due above by 12 and multiply by the number of months you will be a member. This will give you the amount due.

For example;

1. Your Honours membership form is received in April 2011 and approved on the 1st of the following month (i.e. 1st May 2011) = £202.00 ÷ 12 × 8 (May – December) = £134.67 due. Your renewal will be issued in December 2011.

2. You apply for Student Membership in September 2011 and approved on the 1st of the following month and are sitting examinations in June 2012 = £95.00 ÷ 12 × 3 (October – December 2011) + £95.00 (January – December 2012) + £20 one-off joining fee = £138.75. Your renewal will be issued in December 2012.
